Roseville Fire Department Update, Jaime Garrett:

- Upcoming Events-
 - Fireworks sales start soon and go through July 4th. Fireworks can legally be discharged while they are on sale, but not outside that window of time.
 - Weed abatement- People have until July 1 to clean up hazardous weed situations. After that date the city will clean-up at the expense of the property owner.
 - Kids Fire Camp is going on now with 85 kids participating. Past campers are pursuing careers in Firefighting, EMT, and nursing.
 - 4th of July Parade in the AM and Royer Park activities in the afternoon.
 Fireworks in the evening at The Grounds.
 - Parking is challenging so please walk or carpool when possible.
 - Question- Who do we call if we see illegal fireworks?
 - Unless the police department sees a crime being committed they can't do anything.
