<u>Minutes</u>: The minutes of the July 20, 2023 meeting were accepted as amended and placed on file.

Public Comment:

• Concern about some batting cages that have been closed at Mahany Park - a resident would like them to be reopened. It will be brought up at the meeting with the City.

Roseville Police Update, Officer Ciampa:

- Thanks to everyone who registered for NNO. PD visited 22 places.
- There was a K9 Demo today with over 100 people at Mahany and the football field. It was part of a 3 part series, and the next will be on cyber security.
- Officers attend NA monthly meetings- please make sure if there is something specific you want to communicate that you PD let them know ahead of time.
- Introducing Gabe Sorenson-.
 - o He has been with the department for over 5 years.
 - o He is the new Public Safety Programs Coordinator. He has been training for a couple weeks and looks forward to working with our organization.
- Questions
 - o There was a list created for different speakers, is that still available?
 - Yes, email Chris or Gabe to get that list.
 - City list of speakers will also go out with the next group email.
 - o Concern Noticed increased crime in Roseville, specifically near Douglas.
 - There is a plan in action. Please call the PD whenever you see anything.
 In the park and open spaces the social work unit will go out. Code enforcement will address blight issues.

Roseville Fire Department Update, Jaime Garrett:

- Please tell residents to sign up for Emergency Alerts at placeralert.org
 - o It's free to sign up, you can enter multiple addresses and you will be notified if an incident occurs in those areas.
 - o Our chief is in Maui right now helping with recovery
 - o Tomorrow- new firefighter/ paramedics will graduate and go into service in the city. They are laterals and will be able to work right away
 - o When the weather cools FD will schedule the next open house.

Roseville City Update, Brian Jacobson:

- State of the city address is Friday, August 25th at 9:00 am. It's free for anyone who wants to attend. It will not be live streamed but a recording will be available.
- Ribbon cutting for Nicole Gee Drive on Monday August 28th at 9:00 am. The public is welcome.
- My Roseville will be launching in October. Email Brian if you would like to help test the system. They would like feedback.

Regional Homelessness Task Force Presentation: Bonnie Gore

- Introduced herself and staff
- Placer County ranks #6 lowest in California, and the lowest in Northern California for Homelessness.
- Annual point in time count-
 - Federally mandated count where volunteers go out to areas that homeless people spend time and they get a count.
 - Placer county numbers dropped by 6 % in 2023
 - South Placer is where most of them are- 240 in Roseville
- What Placer County has done / recent efforts-
 - Doing better at utilizing data, focusing on the chronically homeless (whole person care), expanding permanent housing options, expanded mental health and addiction services.
 - Reps from different cities and jurisdictions have come together to assess the situation and try to be more effective at addressing the situation.
 - Ad Hoc Task Force came together to address the challenges working with law enforcement.
- Outcomes and Shared Principles
 - Need to decentralize services. Homeless people don't want to leave Roseville because this is where they are from.
 - Leverage existing behavioral health and substance abuse programs- 70% of people on the street have either mental health or substance abuse challenges.
 - When housing is provided, services need to be provided too.
 - Balance compassion with accountability.
 - County-led services- added 82 housing units in Roseville (Douglas and Sunrise), opened Lotus Behavioral Health Crisis Center with 6 urgent care beds in Roseville, Expanded mobile crisis teams, and deployed probation outreach vehicles.
 - Mobile temporary shelter (50 bed non-congregate) in Auburn. It is orderly, well maintained, and it is helping to serve people in need.

Challenges

- o Concerns about the long-term viability of South Placer nomadic shelter models.
- No permanent stable shelter in South Placer
- Evolving legal landscape, working to provide people a place to stay.
- South Placer County has to do something to keep the problem from getting worse.
- The Ad-Hoc group is working together to set up a site for a "South Placer Navigation Center"

Questions

- There was a time when Federal Funds were a big topic of conversation, is there still a lot of money for this cause?
 - Yes, Placer County has received a lot of funds that they put into ongoing efforts.

- Is the powerpoint available?
 - Yes, and Bonnie Gore is happy to talk at Neighborhood meetings
- Is there a plan to replicate the facility in Auburn?
 - It is a model that is working, and might be replicated
- O Do you know what the per-bed cost is? Low barrier shelter?
 - The exact cost is unknown right now.
- Is the Mobile Crisis Team county or PD?
 - both
- Comment about hotel that has been converted to housing- Roseville native who
 is concerned about the safety for her family, not happy about what her family has
 been exposed to.
 - Response- Safety is key. Roseville PD has had very few calls from that area. The residents are renters, they have to pay a portion of their income to live there and they will be kicked out if they are causing problems.
 - Giving people housing gets them out of the creeks and park area
- Concern about the railroad and the people who come into town on the railroad.
 - Roseville PD works well with Union Pacific
- Majority of homeless in the area are locals, it seems like there has been an increase, why?
 - Affordable housing, jobs, mental health and substance issues.

Treasurers Report, Melinda Surmani:

- There is a \$7336 dollar deposit in the account for the Historic Sierra Vista sidewalk grant, it will be paid out for their project.
- If any other NA has special event reimbursement request please send a check request.

- Bonnie has had custom lanyards made for volunteers to wear at RCONA events.
